Minimizing means reducing something unwanted to the smallest degree. From a young age, I learned to minimize my voice and my hurts. Growing up, I feared speaking up, knowing it could lead to punishment. My father was emotionally and verbally abusive, often subjecting me to tests I didn't know I was taking —until I failed. His love was conditional; failure meant rejection. At times, he told me I was dead to him.

His influence shaped my understanding of love and power. His hypersexual nature only deepened my confusion. Lewd conversations were normal at our dinner table, and pornography was scattered throughout our home. This foundation left me distrustful of men—especially those meant to protect me.

The harm extended beyond my home. My grandmother touched me inappropriately, and when I spoke up, I was dismissed. She later stripped me down in a department store as punishment. It even extended to a friend's father who forced me and his daughter to rub sunscreen on him, and again, an adult told me, "Just do it; this is normal." These violations repeated, reinforcing that my body wasn't my own.

By middle school, the damage was evident. A boy pressured me into sexual acts. My gut twisted in resistance, but by then, I had silenced myself so completely that I just gave in. He told me I had acted like I wanted it. Maybe I did. I had learned to yield.

For years, I questioned if God was real. If He existed, why did He allow this to happen to me? Silence was my only answer. I longed for love, but the people who should have loved me only hurt me. I shut everyone out, believing it was safer that way.

Then, in high school, a friend convinced me to attend a retreat. I went for the outdoor activities but found myself in a room listening to a speaker talk about God's love. I grew angry, feeling exposed. As I stood to leave, I heard a voice: "You have been asking Me to show up. Here I am."

That voice changed everything. The speaker described the love of a perfect Father, and for the first time, I dared to believe it was real. My best friend and a staff member explained who Jesus was, and I accepted Him. The darkness lifted, but my healing journey had just begun.

Later, as a missionary, I faced new challenges in a culture where women were oppressed. Men touched me in the streets, but this time, I fought back. For years, I felt like a failure because of my anger, but God showed me it was justified.

Returning home after eight years overseas, I was raw and broken. But God met me. He surrounded me with healthy examples of love. Then, I met my husband. At first, I was terrified. Could I let him in? Would I ever feel safe? He was patient, steady, and unshaken by my fear.

Three years into marriage, I still battle old wounds, but God is making all things new. Isaiah 61 is my anchor: He binds up the brokenhearted and gives beauty instead of ashes. My hope remains in the One who has always seen me, cherished my voice, and will never leave me.

On March 15, we had the privilege of hosting the incredible team from YouVersion, creators of the Bible App, for a full day of filming and interviews. YouVersion travels across the country to document powerful stories of how access to God's Word — through Bible reading plans, devotionals, and other Christcentered resources — is changing lives. We were deeply honored that they chose to highlight the story of GRACE Ministries of Alabama.



Throughout the day, the YouVersion team interviewed our founder, staff, and board members, capturing the heart behind our work. That devotional is now being offered around the world, reaching hearts from the Philippines to California, Texas, Alabama, and beyond.

Today, we are celebrating over 108,349 subscribers to this devotional — a powerful reminder of how God is using technology, truth, and testimony to bring hope and healing to survivors everywhere.

Recently, one of GRACE Ministries of Alabama's appointed speakers, Andrea Fannin, had the opportunity to share with the counselors of Hoover City Schools about the mission of our nonprofit and the resources we offer to survivors of sexual abuse.

Andrea shared her personal testimony, bringing a powerful reminder of how deeply sexual abuse can impact a survivor's life. She emphasized the critical need for awareness, honest conversations, and proactive prevention measures. Andrea also spoke about the importance of providing victims with the help, support, and patience they need to experience healing and true freedom from the pain of their past.

A Dream Come True

I was used to dreaming about the spiritual, though my normal was standing up against demonic attack.

Most nights, I was exploring an unknown house when the heaviness struck my spirit. Seconds later, I was lifted off the ground and no longer in control of my body. My go-to counterattack was always the same. "Jesus! Jesus! (Luke 10:17, Philippians 2:10)." And then I pulled out my sword of the spirit (Ephesians 6:17).

These dreams were always unsettling, and for years I prayed for dreams and visions of the heavenly realm.

On the night of 3/25/25, my surroundings were a blur but the feeling was familiar-I was isolated and lonely, desperate for companionship. I prayed for relief and then **He** was there-**The Son of God**. The One whose name I had spoken for so many nights in battle. It was merely His presence that changed me and that was enough for me. But, He held out His left arm to me, and I embraced it fiercely-holding it in the nape of my neck and cradling it with my face. I never intended to let go.

He didn't speak, though, He didn't need to.

His touch was enough to satisfy me forever. His peace flooded my spirit and enveloped me like a cloud. Time stood still and nothing else mattered. It seemed as though I was no longer in control of my body, but this time I wasn't afraid. Because I was in the arm of my Savior, and my dream had finally come true.
